Kowhai Curriculum for Term Four

Integrated topic (Science, Social Science and Religious Education) Caring for our Earth

We are continuing this unit this term as there is so much to cover under this amazing topic. The students are really enjoying learning about how they can protect the Earth.

Religious Education

As well as the above unit we will focus on All Saints and All Souls days and then Advent. October is also the Month of the Rosary so we will be looking at the Rosary and the importance of this form of prayer.

Mathematics

Number continues to be our major focus and this term we revise all of the number skills and strategies that they have learnt this year as well as algebra. We also continue to focus heavily on consolidating our number knowledge, fractions, place value, ordering and reading numbers. We will be looking at a variety of strands in Mathematics across the syndicate depending on the need of the students at each level but they may include probability, volume, transformation and tessellation. Practise at home will greatly support your child. Our study ladder tasks are set up to provide reinforcement in these areas.

Literacy

In Kowhai syndicate our reading and writing is closely linked to our topic study. This helps us to use our reading and writing as a learning tool. We will focus closely this term on being able to recognise the **structures** that author's use in their writing and how they vary according to the genre. With the school speech competition being held this term the structure of an argument will be a major focus.

Te Reo

This term the focus is Kai. Students will learn words and phrases that will support them in being able to discuss what they like and don't like, quantities, quality and the cost of items of food. There will also be links to Mathematics and Health through this unit.

Physical Education /Health

This term we have our school athletics as well as our weekly trips to Nairnville. We will also be continuing to cover the NZ Police education unit **Keeping Ourselves Safe.**
